# THE WOW FACTOR: OneHeart's 2025 Outcomes



## A Message from our CEO

Five years into operating our transformation campus, OneHeart has become more than a place for hope and healing—it has grown into a community where new beginnings become self-sufficient lives, where people find their place and purpose, chart courses to independence, and learn to be kinder and more grateful in the process. This year, the campus felt alive with that energy. You could sense it in the halls, at the dinner tables, in the classrooms, and during early morning rides to work and school.

In 2025, our guests continued to raise the bar on what's possible. Education remained a powerful pathway: since January 1, about 30% of adult guests were enrolled in GED® programs and another 35% pursued higher education degrees—tangible steps toward increased earning potential and long-term stability. Across the year, we saw education and employment show up again and again among the top goals guests set and worked to achieve, underscoring how central learning and dignified work are to lasting change.

## Education & Upward Mobility

Our partners helped adults not just go back to school, but succeed there—completing prerequisites, persisting through semesters, and building confidence. In prior cycles we documented 182 adults working on higher education goals, and 2025 continued that momentum with another 41 guests moving from crisis to classrooms, and from classrooms into careers.

## Evidence of Impact

External evaluation estimates over \$4.6M in community savings as crises stabilize and families regain footing, while the likelihood of achieving goals rises the longer a guest stays engaged in programming. This validates what we see every day: time, safety, and accountability create space for extraordinary growth, and stellar results!

I also want to share something personal. On three occasions I have witnessed integrity bloom—moments when people made the hard choice because it was the right choice. Quiet commitments kept; honoring sobriety in the face of pressure; owning a mistake and making it right; ready to accept consequences. These moments remind me that transformation is not only measured in numbers; it is measured by character. And it happens every day on this amazing campus.



As OneHeart marks five years, the campus itself has transformed. What started as a vision is now a living ecosystem—care coordinators guiding Options Based Planning™, partners co-located on campus, safe supportive transitional housing, reliable transportation to work and school, and a culture that prizes dignity and accountability. This is a place where new beginnings turn into self-sufficient community members, and where OneHeart children’s school attendance outpaces local averages—clear signals that we are breaking cycles and building more stable futures.

**None of this happens without you.** Board members, community partners, provider partners, and donors, your trust and support converts compassion into impact—into degrees earned, jobs kept, debts retired, vehicles purchased, residences leased, and lives changed for the better.

As you read this report, I hope you feel the heartbeat of progress. The data will show outcomes that matter; the stories will show lives that have changed. **Together, we are proving that when people are empowered and held accountable—and when a community stands with them—integrity blooms, hope takes root, and second chances become success.**

# ONEHEART IS #1 in Transforming Lives...

OneHeart is a campus-style program located near downtown Rapid City, designed to empower individuals and families as they move beyond crisis toward lasting self-sufficiency. Through a holistic, long-term approach predicated on brain science and choice architecture, OneHeart provides the resources, support, environment, time, and accountability needed for people who are ready to transform their lives, break the vicious cycle of poverty and build a better future.

**OneHeart served a total of 223 guests in 2025,  
105 of whom were children**



- Nearly **50% of all goals set by guests were accomplished** in 2025. The four goals most abundantly set are: life skills, financial (budgeting, debt management and increased earning potential), education, and employment.



- We added **22 people to the workforce**, bringing our total of new and stable employees in the workforce to **161 people since opening**.



- **17 adult guests opened bank accounts** for the first time.



- Nearly **\$40,000 in debt was paid down** in 2025 by OneHeart guests alone!



- **26 guests** were able to **purchase reliable transportation** of their own!

## Why is this such a BIG deal?

Because the burdens people are saddled with when they reach our doorstep are great and would otherwise be insurmountable but for the structured support we and our partners provide in a wrap-around manner through the OneHeart collaborative.

- **77% of families are led by single mothers** (including one with five children).
- **86% of adult guests have struggled with substance use.**
- **29% relied on our transportation program** for work or school due to lack of reliable transportation.
- **Most families come from poverty:** 49% situational, 36% generational, 15% working-class poverty.
- **73% are survivors of violent crime**, and many carry significant debt (medical, legal, or education-related).
- **YMCA provided child development services for 36 OneHeart children** – 21 on campus and 15 off campus.

## From Addiction & Crisis to College Graduate

Desirae came to OneHeart active in addiction, in and out of jail and had just lost her children. Thanks to OneHeart she returned to college after leaving in 2011. Now she will graduate with her bachelor's degree in human services in 2027. She wants to use this to become a chemical dependency counselor or a mental health counselor.

*"Being able just to provide a home and a space for my children to grow up and be able to be happy with a mom," Desirae said. "And for them to see how far I've come and no matter how hard it might be, if mom can do it, I can."*

## From Grief & Addiction to Purpose in the Trades

Before OneHeart, Ricky turned to alcohol after his father passed away. This quickly spiraled into addiction and depression. Since coming to OneHeart, Ricky has gotten a job and is now working towards getting his installers license for pipe laying.

# TRANSFORMATION PROGRAMMING...

The one thing most people struggling with poverty have in common is living high-crisis, high-stress lifestyles. It makes sense that when resources are limited, challenges to simply survive increase. This type of living has a negative impact on the brain such that people often make decisions based on immediate survival needs, rather than long-term stability. This makes it nearly impossible to forge a path out. OneHeart addresses this through programming rooted in brain science and choice architecture, alleviating the lingering effects of high-crisis living on the brain, and helping program participants shift to goal-oriented progress for future stability in the workforce and in the community.

To our knowledge, there is no other model like this, and we wouldn't have the success we do without the dedicated staff that make this campus a place for true transformation to take place.



**CASE MANAGEMENT:** Care Coordinators are the first people newly enrolled guests meet when they arrive on campus. Care Coordinators are responsible for assisting each person with accessing all of the resources they need to get their lives on a positive track. They hold guests accountable to goals through the use of our Options-Based Planning™ (OBP™) intervention that teaches guests to prioritize goals, action, and accountability, positioning themselves to lead self-sufficient lives.



**LIFE SAFETY & RESIDENTIAL SUPPORT:** The Life Safety & Residential Support Services team not only keeps the campus safe, looking out for and protecting our guests 24/7, they also assist with the needs and challenges that arise with daily life. This is super important until people fully come out of crisis brain and can manage all the things life throws their way on their own.



**FOOD SERVICES:** One of the favorite parts of transitional living at OneHeart is the culinary delights cooked up every day by Chef Sarah. Through creative and diverse menu options and our partnership with Feeding South Dakota, Chef Sarah makes sure no one goes hungry on campus. What's more—she is feeding them healthy, well-balanced meals, to the tune of nearly 14,000 meals served in 2025 alone!

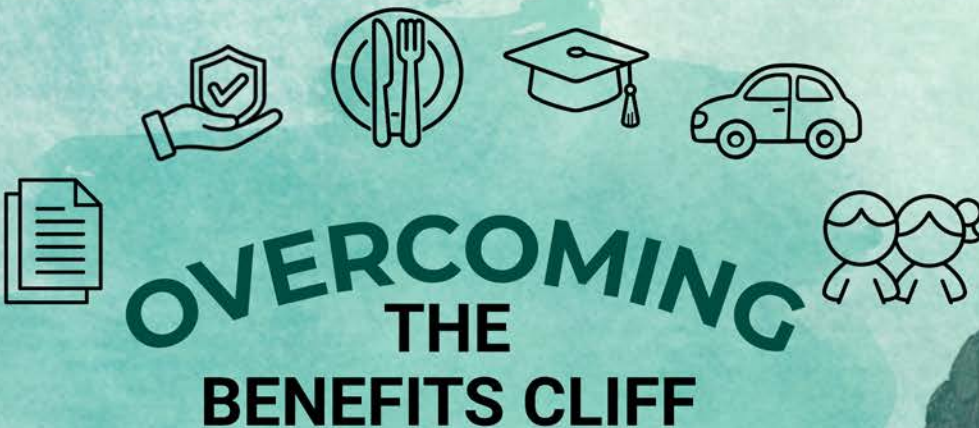


## CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER AT ONEHEART

**MANAGED BY YMCA:** Let's face it, even people NOT in poverty struggle with accessing quality childcare. With education being such a crucial piece of upward mobility for adults, it wouldn't have been good enough to simply have a daycare or babysitter on campus for OneHeart guests. Our partnership with YMCA has ensured that preschool children and babies have access to early child development that will build strong foundations for learning the rest of their lives. **WESTERN DAKOTA TECHNICAL COLLEGE:** WDT has been a partner since before the campus opened. Dedicated to student success, they have been a solid presence on campus, exposing OneHeart program participants to the possibility of higher education. Not only are they a terrific partner to have on campus, their mechanics students took on the project of fixing the wiring in OneHeart's old truck plow so that we could clear our parking lots of snow. It was a great learning experience for their students and helped us out in a time when resources for these types of repairs was limited. # OVERCOMING THE BENEFITS CLIFF

Picture this, a single mother earning \$18/hour who accepts a \$20/hour promotion might lose \$8,000/year in benefits (SNAP, Medicaid, childcare subsidies), resulting in a net DECREASE of \$4,000 annually.

Poverty is not just a personal struggle—it is often a systemic labyrinth that keeps individuals trapped despite their best efforts to escape.

The "cliff effect," describes the financial freefall that occurs when individuals working to improve their lives lose critical benefits more quickly than their earnings increase. For those living on the edge of poverty, even a modest pay raise can result in a net loss, leaving them worse off than before.

At OneHeart, we understand the devastating implications of the cliff effect. Our mission is to not only support individuals through immediate crises when they arrive but also to dismantle the systemic barriers that perpetuate cycles of poverty. Through innovative programs and holistic support, we level the cliff and empower our guests to chart a sustainable path forward.

What makes OneHeart unique is our ability to **flatten the cliff**. Instead of forcing individuals to choose between bettering themselves and maintaining financial stability, we create a bridge that supports them through the transition. In other words, we support them as they increase their earning potential so they no longer fall prey to the benefits cliff as they transition into society.

The cliff effect is not just an issue for those experiencing poverty—it is a reflection of systemic inequities that affect us all. *When we allow individuals to fall through the cracks, we lose out on their potential to contribute to society.*

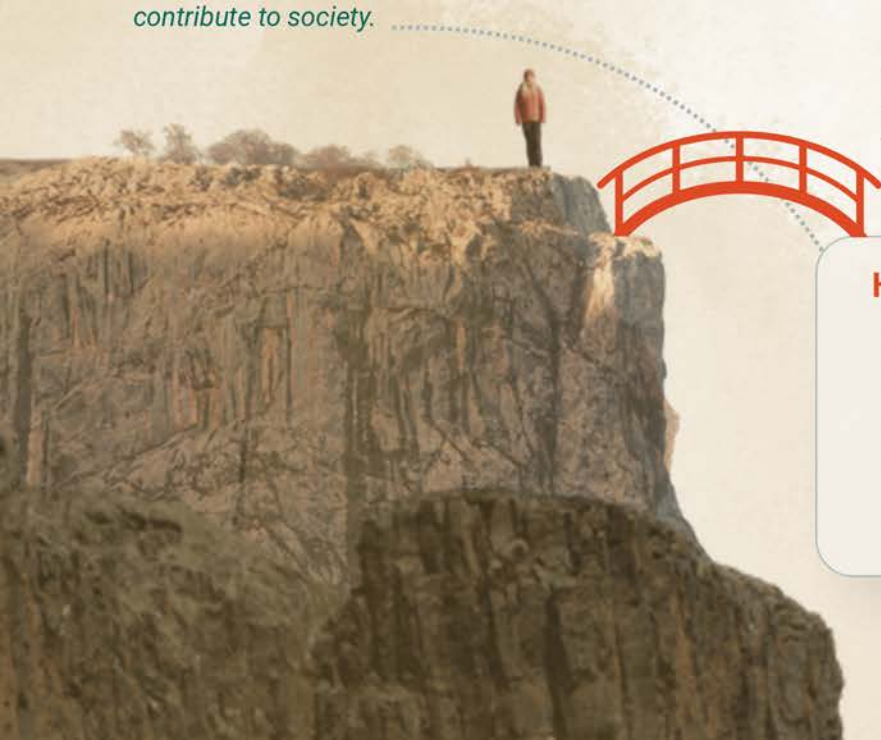

# RETURN ON COMMUNITY'S Vision Fund Award



IN COMMUNITY SAVINGS OVER 5 YEARS

OneHeart's innovative approach has delivered a strong return on the \$5M in Vision funds awarded by Rapid City taxpayers in 2019. That grant contributed to the \$17M campus purchase and renovation, while reducing reliance on costly emergency services and improving school attendance. These outcomes have generated over \$4.6M in direct service savings, along with \$7M in external funding brought into the community—totaling more than \$11.6M in community savings over five years.

Each dollar invested in OneHeart helps individuals move from crisis to self-sufficiency, addressing root causes rather than symptoms. Despite a slightly higher cost per guest, the results—lower crime, improved health, better school attendance, and long-term stability—are transformative and compound over time. By securing outside funding and helping residents overcome the benefits cliff, OneHeart continues to drive lasting change and economic resilience in the community.

In 2021, OneHeart launched longitudinal studies with support from the Administration for Children & Families, helping redefine what's possible in the fight against poverty. By combining brain science, thoughtful program design, and evidence-informed practices, OneHeart has become a place of hope and opportunity in Rapid City.

At the center of this work is the Crisis to Thrive (C to T) scale—a holistic tool that tracks progress across areas like childcare, education, employment, housing, and transportation. It ensures each person's journey from crisis to stability is understood, supported, and celebrated.

Since opening in January 2021, OneHeart has built a strong culture of learning and accountability. The results are clear: guests who stay longer than six months are far more likely to secure stable housing and employment. On average, participants see a 40% improvement in their C to T scores, with 68% reporting greater self-sufficiency.

The impact extends to the broader community. For every dollar invested, OneHeart generates an estimated \$2.50 in savings through reduced emergency services and increased workforce participation. More than \$7M has been brought in from outside the community, over 160 individuals have joined the workforce, service calls have dropped by 74%, and arrests among adult guests have decreased by 93%—all while improving school attendance for children.

This work is more than a program—it's a shared effort to help people move beyond crisis and build stable, thriving futures.

# DON'T JUST TAKE Our Word For It...

## An Opinion of OneHeart's Efficacy from an Outside Perspective

As a Principal Researcher at Mathematica, a nonpartisan research and advisory firm, I had the privilege of working alongside the OneHeart team for nearly three years.

The need for comprehensive, holistic, and co-located services like OneHeart offers is significant and widespread in Rapid City. More than 16% of the Rapid City population—and 21% of children—live in conditions of poverty. These rates are substantially higher than the state and national averages. Much of this is due to generational poverty and substance use, two issues which are ingrained and difficult to address.

“As an expert on programs designed to reduce poverty and increase family stability, I can attest that OneHeart serves families in ways that are rooted in research evidence. For example, research shows that client-centered services that consider the needs and goals of the clients—as OneHeart does through its Option-Based Planning—are more effective than those that impose rigid requirements.

In addition, comprehensive, co-located services like OneHeart offers show promise in effectively serving families facing difficult challenges. Thus, I believe that OneHeart has the potential to make a real impact in Rapid City.”

# THE ONEHEART UNIVERSE



## ONEHEART TRANSFORMATION PROGRAM

Our state-of-the-art campus and holistic approach, predicated on brain science and choice architecture, empower participants to shift from survival mode to intentional future planning. Here, they receive safe, clean, and sober transitional housing, utilities, Wi-Fi, meals, and transportation at no cost, allowing them to focus on healing, paying off debt, saving money, advancing their education or acquiring new skills, reuniting their families, and forging brighter futures. Our campus includes a wellness center, coffee shop, and child development center, and in honor of our local heritage, a talking circle room, sweat lodge, and ceremony house. This campus, described by program participants as “winning the lottery”, gives people their voices back, empowering them to rebuild their confidence, pursue dreams, and build better lives. And with 50% of our campus guests being children, we are breaking negative cycles for future generations.



## ATRIUM PROGRAM

Born from the heartbreak of seeing relapses derail our guests, Atrium offers structured support and accountability to women battling substance use disorders. Since its inception in March of 2024, Atrium has shown incredible success, with zero lapses or relapses—a testament to the power of intentional, compassionate care, serving 18 unique individuals. So far, 61% have completed programming including six new graduates in 2025.

Our Positive Rental History Program bridges the gap for OneHeart graduates with challenging rental histories, helping them build a positive rental resume. This program provides a crucial step into the community, offering a supportive environment where participants can pay rent, work on securing permanent housing, and demonstrate their reliability to future landlords.
